CHRIST IS RISEN... HE IS RISEN INDEED!

Matt 28:5-7a

"5 But the angel answered and said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. 6 He is not here; for He is risen, as He said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay. 7 And go quickly and tell His disciples that He is risen from the dead..."

As we have shared over the past several weeks, the most Holy of Holy Days for Christians is almost upon us - Easter... "Resurrection Sunday." Though it may stagger our imagination to try to fully understand this truth, all of the promises of God (that is, all that the Scriptures have promised) find their fulfillment in the person of Jesus Christ, and in particular His Resurrection. From the very beginning, God promised fallen man a Savior (Genesis

3:15). As we look through the pages of Scripture, we see a type of "scarlet thread" (the symbol of Christ's shed blood that was to come) painting the beautiful work of Christ that was to come. All the mercy and forgiveness of God for His people, all the spilled blood of animals, the Passover, the Exodus, the Ark, the passing through the sea... all of these things pointed to the ultimate salvation of God that would be found in the Death (and ultimately the Resurrection) of Christ.

Without the Cross, there is NO forgiveness of sin, no salvation, and no hope. Not too many denominations today like to talk about the Cross of Christ. Some say that the cross is too bloody and the suffering of Christ offensive to

share sermons of the resurrection and the finished work of Christ and bypass the cross altogether. But therein is where we find the problem... There can be no resurrection without first having a crucified Savior. The resurrection loses its full revelation and impact unless Christ suffers first. And... in order for that suffering to be fully understood, we must understand "why" He suffered and died; and that,

to take the condemnation for sin that was supposed to come to us! Easter is not just a happy ending to a tragic event, but rather it was God's answer for a broken people who were lost in sin with no way to save themselves. Sin... that would have seen our lives destroyed and our souls in hell has been defeated! Sin was no more to be our master and destroyer of our lives. Christ The Lord conquered death, hell, and the grave, and has set us free to walk in the forgiveness and grace of the living God.

One of the things that I love most about the resurrection story (as you can see above) is that the angels did not simply announce that "Christ was risen", but they also offered proof... "Come, see the place where the Lord lay!" In essence they were saying, come see for yourself... He is not here... He is Risen... just like He promised! And if you think about it, we can do that too! We can show others that Jesus is Risen! We can show the power of Easter. How? The next time someone asks for proof, just point back to your life

and explain... come, look at my heart and see where the broken shackles of sin now lay. I am no longer bound to sin or death! Because Jesus lives, I shall live also. He is risen! Yes, He is risen indeed!

Greetings!

I pray that you are excited about our upcoming Easter service and the opportunities that this season presents to serve those who visit with us! I have been in prayer daily that we will see commitments to Christ, and that we as believers are renewed and revived by the truth of the resurrection!

While Christmas is very precious to me, I am most thankful for Easter. I would argue that without Easter, without the resurrection, Christmas would be just another holiday. I believe Christianity begins with the resurrection. According to the apostle Paul, "And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain," (1 Cor. 15:14 ESV) meaning that if the resurrection of Jesus never happened, then Christianity as a whole crumbles.

So is the resurrection something we simply celebrate once a year with a special Sunday worship service, or should the resurrection be ingrained in every

aspect of our lives? Paul equates walking with God, knowing God, to knowing the power of His resurrection (Phil. 3:10). While I'm sure we all want to learn more about the details of the resurrection, and some of you may have even had the privilege of seeing the empty tomb in the Holy Land, simple knowledge isn't what Paul is speaking of. Paul implies that the resurrection power of Jesus must be experienced and lived. When we follow Jesus' example in baptism, it symbolizes dying to our sinful nature and being raised as a new creation. Paul tells the Romans that "our old self was crucified with Him so that the body ruled by sin might be rendered powerless so that we may no longer be enslaved to sin, since a person who has died is freed from sin. Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with Him...". (Romans 6:6-8 CSB) I will encourage you as a believer, the resurrection power of Jesus is within you! For without it, there would be no freedom from sin - no eternal life. When we seek for more and more of Jesus, we will inevitably find the transformational power of the resurrection!

I would also like to share some good news; I am very pleased to inform our church family that our choir room can once again be used for rehearsals! The extensive damage caused by multiple roof leaks has been repaired. We have a new ceiling, fresh coat of paint, and clean carpet! We are blessed to have such a space to learn and prepare to lead worship each time we gather.

As some of you know, I have the privilege to teach Instrumental Music at our Academy. Just to give a picture of what that looks like, our ensemble is composed of the following: Flute, Clarinets, Saxophones, Trumpets, Trombones, Tuba, and Percussion. These children have worked extremely hard this semester and have exceeded every expectation that I have had. Dear Family,

I've gotta verse that I'm really leaning into these days— Philippians 3:10-11 (NKJV):

"That I may know Him and the power of His resurrection, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death; if, by any means, I may attain to the resurrection from the dead."

I'll be turning 50 years old in a month and for whatever reason 50 is hitting me hard. Life is so short and I can see the end of mine coming so fast at this point. I mean, 10 years goes ridiculously fast! My choices are all coming into focus these days with much greater scrutiny. What am I doing? What am I not doing? What do I fear? As I ask these questions, the honest answer is that most of what I do has to do with me running from something. I hate to admit that. I don't want to suffer, and I'm afraid that I've lived 50 years of my life trying my best to avoid it. It has taken me that long to figure out that when you live to avoid suffering, you only suffer more.

We live in a world of suffering and we will all feel that one way or another. The question is: Are you facing it with purpose? It is meaningful suffering? Are you suffering regrets for foolish choices, or are you suffering choices of discipline as you trust a perfect God who can redeem it all?

At this late hour in my life, I'm beginning to embrace suffering for the first time. I do regret how long it had taken me to figure it out, but I can't help but thank God for revealing it to me at all! I can see that most people never do figure it out. What a blessing that we are given the privilege of choice. We can choose our suffering. I choose to suffer with Jesus, allow His Spirit of wisdom to show me what choices to make, and allow Him to redeem all that He sees fit. Psalm 39:4 (NASB) is a powerful mindset for us all to have: "Lord, let me know my end and what is the extent of my days; let me know how transient I am."

As we surrender our short lives to His eternal life, Jesus makes us overcomers like Him. Jesus is the greatest investor to ever live. 

Tennessee Avenue Families, Early Childhood Education



One of the most important series of events in Christian history is approaching. The death, burial, and resurrection of our Savior. And oh, what a Savior He is! Often during this time of year, we think of Jesus as our Shepherd, our Lamb, and the Lion of Judah.

John 10:14-15 (KJV) says: "I am the good shepherd, and know my sheep, and am known of mine. As the Father knoweth me, even so know I the Father: and I lay down my life for the sheep." How amazing that Jesus knew all along that He was our Shepherd. He knew that He was there to take care of and minister to the people while He was on earth, and even now.

But let's go a bit further. The Shepherd doesn't just care for the well-to-do, got it all together, never misses a beat sheep. He always cares for those who are weak, and fail, get lost, stumble, or maybe are even considered

the "black sheep". One of the most popular phrases we often see these days is "He left the 99 for me" based on the parable from Jesus in Matthew 18:12-14 (NKJV) that says, "What do you think? If a man has a hundred sheep, and one of them goes astray, does he not leave the ninety-nine and go to the mountains to seek the one that is straying? And if he should find it, assuredly, I say to you, he rejoices more over that sheep than over the ninety-nine that did not go astray. Even so it is not the will of your Father who is in heaven that one of these little ones should perish." Again, how amazing it is to know that our Shepherd cares for us even when we go astray. And we all go astray sometimes. There is none perfect, except Jesus. And He comes looking for us!

Also, Jesus is seen as our Lamb. During His time on earth, He was humble and lowly. Even though He was a Man of supernatural significance, He did not behave that way. We see John proclaim Jesus as the "Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29). He was the Shepherd sent to care for us, the Lamb that was sent to save us....and then came the Lion! He wasn't just crucified and buried to be left for all eternity. He was buried, and then arose, Roaring! Granted, He probably wasn't literally roaring, but what happened was as astonishing and loud as the Lion's roar. He conquered death and the grave, all to save us. He didn't go quietly into the night. He appeared to his followers several times and was taken to heaven in a cloud of glory, that was visible to many. Like Revelation 5:5 (NKJV) says right in the middle of the verse: "Behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has prevailed".

So, Jesus is our caring "Good Shepherd", our meek and gentle "Lamb", and our strong and mighty Savior, the "Lion". I don't know about you, but that makes me feel incredibly loved and cherished!
